Qualification Objectives

What does this qualification cover?

The objective of this qualification is to provide learners with an introduction to the work of the Fire and Rescue Service.

Who is the qualification for?

This qualification is aimed at those learners who are interested in knowing more about the work of the Fire and Rescue Service. As the qualification is available for young people from 14 years, it is therefore suitable for use as part of a cadet programme.

Who supports this qualification?

The qualification has been developed in collaboration with Fire and Rescue Services.



Qualification Progression

What future education could this qualification lead to?

Learners could progress to other fire and rescue or public services qualifications or apprenticeships.

What future employment could this qualification lead to?

This qualification could lead to a career in the Fire and Rescue Service or other related public services.



Qualification Achievement

What are the entry requirements for the qualification?

Prior to registration learners are required to be:

- accurately identified
- at least 14 years of age

How is the qualification achieved?

The learner will need to complete one mandatory unit (4 credits) and a minimum of five optional units (9 credits).

What will be assessed?

Learner's knowledge through assessments determined by the centre and demonstration of skills in the training environment.

How will it be assessed?

This qualification contains one mandatory unit to be completed by the learner. The unit is comprised of a number of learning outcomes and assessment criteria which must all be achieved.

Learning outcomes that begin 'The learner will understand...' will be assessed through theory-based activities.

Learning outcomes that begin 'The learner will be able to...' are assessed through practical activities.

 - Are occupationally knowledgeable in the work of the fire and rescue service
 - Have current occupational competence in fire and rescue service drills and use of relevant equipment
- Assessors who are:
 - Qualified with a recognised assessor qualification, or
 - Working towards a recognised assessor qualification, or
 - Able to prove equivalent competence through training to appropriate national standards
- IQA(s) who are:
 - Qualified with a recognised IQA qualification, or
 - Working towards a recognised IQA qualification, or
 - Able to prove equivalent competence through training to appropriate national standards
