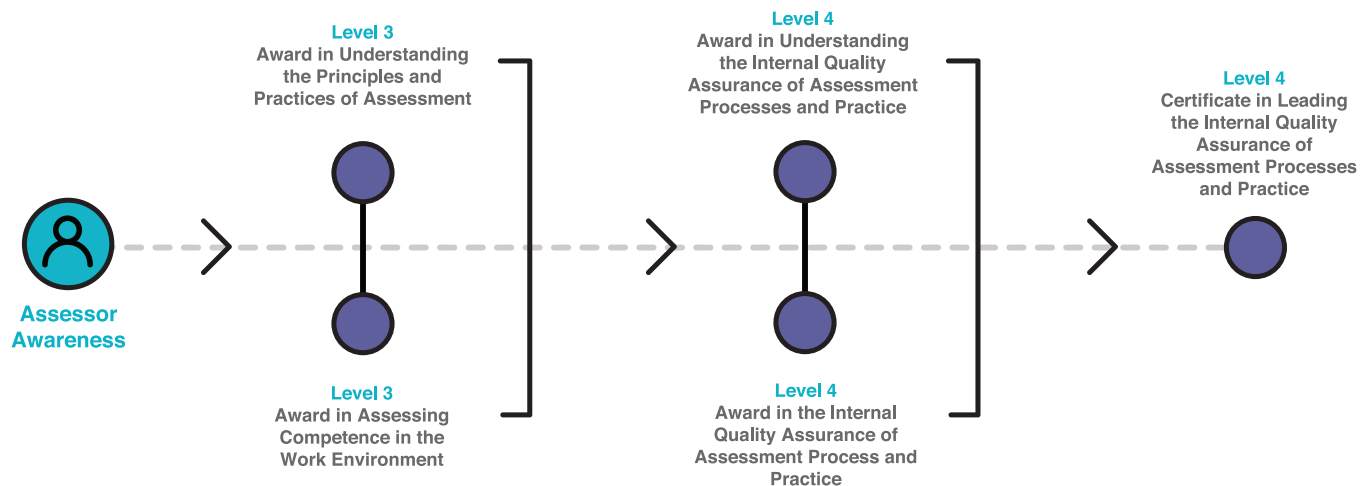
Who this training is for
