The broad purpose of the occupation is to assess the level of fire safety in the built environment and instigate improvements, where necessary, to preserve life, to reduce damage to property and the environment and to support economic growth.

Towards End-Point Assessment

On-Programme Training

Minimum on-programme duration as stated in the standard. In all cases this will be no less than 366 days but may be longer. Training off and on the job.

Gateway requirements

- Diploma in Fire Safety (Fire Inspectors)
- Complete training towards English and maths qualifications in line with the apprenticeship funding rules.

End-Point Assessment Methods



Practical Assessment with

questions This method has two components.



Knowledge Test Apprentices must be observed by an independent assessor who will take on the role of the 'Responsible Person'. There are 5 stages to the Practical Assessment:

- Preparation and Briefing
- Documentation Review
- Visual Inspection of Premise
- Post Audit Debrief
- Post Audit Questions

The practical assessment with questions must take 3 hours 15 minutes

60-minute professional discussion covering the following areas:

- Legislation, policies, and procedures
- Audit and enforcement
- Safeguarding
- Working with groups and individuals
- Working with other agencies.
- Paper 1 (open book test 1 hour)

Paper 2 (closed book test - 2 hours)
